The Saving Smiles for Miles program is a public health supervised evidence-based dental hygiene service that is school/community based and provides care once a year in alternative settings. This service does not replace the comprehensive routine care of a licensed dentist. We know that poor oral health can lead to decreased school performance, poor social relationships, and less success later in life. FLUORIDE VARNISH

Fluoride varnish is a highly concentrated form of fluoride that is applied to tooth surfaces by oral health professionals or other health professionals to prevent dental caries. Fluoride varnish applied every 6 months is effective in preventing dental caries in the primary and permanent teeth of children and adolescent at moderate to high risk. For those at high risk, receiving fluoride varnish every 3 months may provide an additional caries prevention benefit. (Marinho VC, Higgins JP, Logan S, Sheiham A. 2002. SILVER DIAMINE FLUORIDE

DENTAL SEALANTS (CONTAIN FLUORIDE)

Dental sealants are thin plastic coatings that are applied to the pits and fissures (grooves) on the chewing surfaces of molar teeth. Most tooth decay experienced by children and adolescents occurs on these surfaces. Sealants prevent dental caries (tooth decay) by creating a physical barrier against bacterial plaque and food. RADIOGRAPHS (X-RAYS)

All radiographs are taken by licensed clinicians and will be diagnosed by a licensed dentist within 21 days of being taken.

TEMPORARY FILLINGS (FLUORIDE RELEASING)

A temporary filling is a short-term use material which can restore missing tooth structure until such time as definitive treatment of the tooth is possible. It may incorporate sedative materials for pulpal pain. (Temporary filling | definition of temporary filling by Medical dictionary medical-dictionary.thefreedictionary.com/temporary+filling)

IMPORTANT -This is not a permanent restoration.

*We recommend patients be seen by a dentist within 30 to 60 days of temporary filling placement to prevent your condition from getting worse. *

PARENTS QUESTIONS ON QUALIFICATION FOR SERVICES

My child has MaineCare dental insurance. Do we qualify for preventive dental care through the Saving Smiles for Miles Program? Yes, we accept MaineCare Insurance.

My child has a regular dentist. Can he/she have preventive dental care through the Saving Smiles for Miles Program instead? No, we encourage people who receive regular dental care with a dentist to stay with their dental home. We cannot see patients that have a dentist that they see regularly every year.

My child has regular dental insurance coverage. Will that cover services through the Saving Smiles for Miles Program? No, we do not accept all insurances. We are a provider for MaineCare participants and those who qualify that have no dental coverage.

My child has no insurance. How do I know if he/she qualifies for preventive dental care through the Saving Smiles for Miles Program? If your child has no dental insurance coverage and qualifies for school free/reduced lunch then they qualify for care.
